

LAMU LOGO



The University logo is a symbol of medical and professional excellence, that our graduands proudly wear as an emblem. The emblem features a drum for the body with a shield, syringe & scalpel, an open book and a torch with flames, with a ribbon at the bottom reading “Knowledge and Excellence”.

Each of these symbols has a deeper meaning that ties into the heart of what Lusaka Apex Medical University is about.

The drum is the traditional mechanism for passing on information and knowledge which represents education and communication in the traditional sense.









The syringe & scalpel are the fundamental tools of modern medicine and surgery to administer the appropriate treatment and for the access of the internal organs. The torch with flames is a symbol of light against ignorance and peril, and also signifies the sterilizing power of heat.

The open book is the universal symbol of the depository of knowledge and information, and is the international medium of the delivery of education. The inside of the book consists of leaves and they are the pages of the book but also represent actual leaves from plants which are the symbols of traditional medicine and the root source of most modern medicines that treat us when inflicted with diseases and infections.

The shield is a symbol of traditional protection and therefore represents a barrier from diseases, ignorance and physical harm.

The ribbon reading “Knowledge & Excellence” symbolises that knowledge is what every human being strives for, to achieve excellence in everything they do. The University logo therefore, highlights its vision and institutional aspirations.

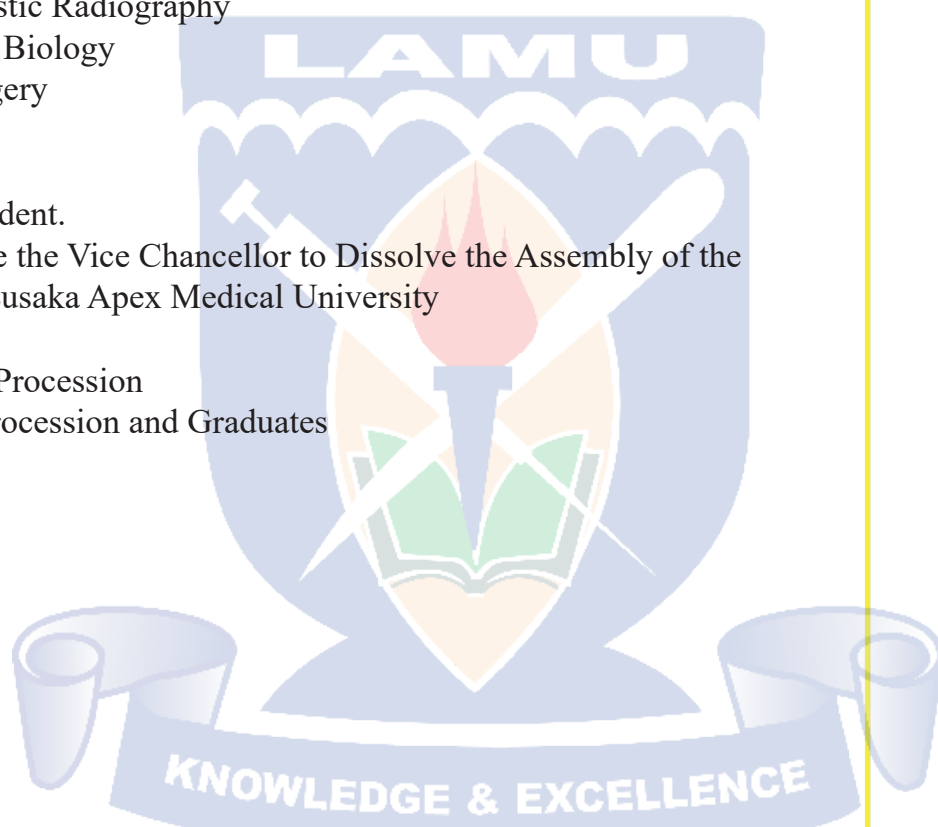

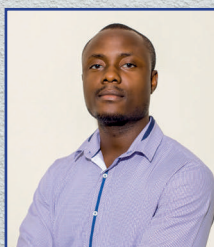

Once again, congratulations.

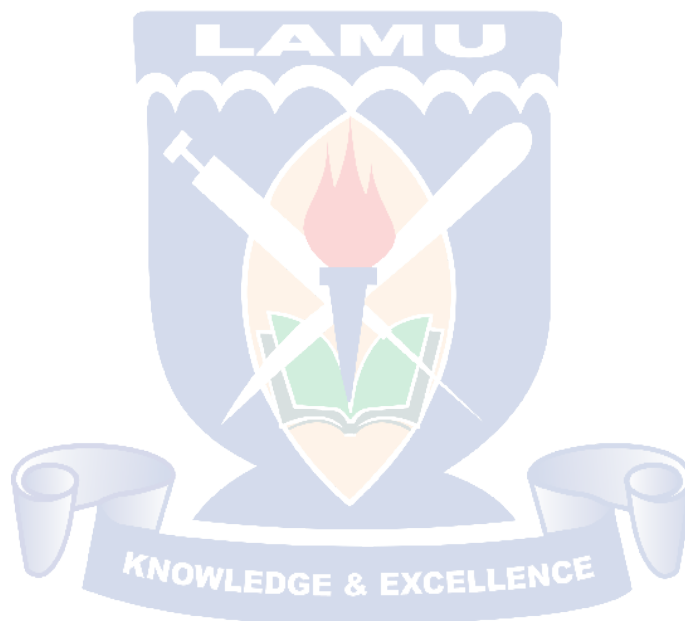

I will respect the secrets that are confided in me, even after the patient has died;

I will practise my profession with conscience and dignity and in accordance with good medical practice;

I will foster the honor and noble traditions of the medical profession;

I will give to my teachers, colleagues, and students the respect and gratitude that is their due;

I will share my medical knowledge for the benefit of the patient and the advancement of healthcare;

I will attend to my own health, well-being, and abilities in order to provide care of the highest standard;

I will not use my medical knowledge to violate human rights and civil liberties, even under threat;

I make these promises solemnly, freely, and upon my honor.
